MK Struggles

The life of an MK is fascinating; most know several languages and have lived in different parts of the world. Yet the pressures of being dragged around to wherever their parents are called can create some tough situations for these precious kids.

One of my youngest students, M.F., is in 3rd grade. I'm his 3rd violin teacher in 3 years! The life of an MK is one of constant transition. M.F. has been hesitant to open up to me. How long will it be before he has to have yet another violin teacher? Why should he make himself vulnerable by sharing his childhood hopes and dreams if I will disappear after a year?

One of my high school violin students, J.K., struggles in some of his classes because English is not his first language. In Korean History class, however, he discovered that he could not keep up with the advanced Korean because his is at an elementary level. He speaks two languages, but is academically fluent in neither. My cellist, S.S., was going to buy a new cello, but could not because her parents are going to send her sister to BFA next year instead. Money is tight as an MK. My heart breaks for the financial limits of my students!

All of the students at BFA have experienced struggles in their backgrounds. BFA is a place where all of them can identify with each other. It often feels more like home than any other place simply because there are others who are going through the same situations.
