## Berlin

April 30-May 2 was the orchestra field trip to Berlin, the capital of Germany. Four students (two girls and two boys) and two chaperones (a math teacher named Dr. McCormack and myself) attended.

The trip gave the students an opportunity to learn some music history, hear a professional orchestra concert, bond as a group, and bless others by performing concerts.

We played at a Christian school and a church in Berlin. The church appreciated the music so much they gave us 50 Euros! My students started discussing what to do with the money, and of course the first thought was "Ice cream!" I was really proud of them, however, when they decided they wanted to put the money to a more meaningful cause. Part of it will probably still go to some ice cream, but you'll have to read my next newsletter to find out where the rest of it will go!

The field trip gave me some really great opportunities to talk with the students about meaningful issues, such as decisions about the future. I had a couple late-night conversations that made us tired the next day, but they were definitely worthwhile! The students really bonded, and I was able to get closer to each one.
